


























OUR MISSION







Saskatchewan Forest Sector Support Program • Peter Sigurdson

- FPInnovations: Partner with the Prince Albert Model Forest to bring FPInnovations' successful Building Wealth with Wood program to Saskatchewan
- Project with Western Diversification Program in Saskatoon to obtain funding over three years
- Leveraged funding provided by program partners, including businesses and communities.
 - 15% minimum company contribution
 - 40% other funding partners
 - 37-50% contribution from WD. (37%)
- Funding from WD has been secured, strong support from Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal businesses in the province, from the CFS AFI Program - provincial government support applied for at the project level.

- Technical analyses: new sawmills, post plants, district heating projects
- Marketing Saskatchewan Forest Products to U.S. and offshore buyers

Aboriginal Housing

- Shortage of an estimated 40,000 to 80,000 housing units for Canada's Aboriginal communities.
- The same range (40,000 to 80,000 or more) requiring repair.



Canadian Aboriginal Housing

 Wherever possible and cost efficient, facilitate the use of local materials (thereby creating local jobs), and utilize local forest products to help reduce the material and shipping costs which should lead to shorter wait times for affordable and appropriate Aboriginal housing


